- This can result in a lack of vigilance towards potential risks and safety protocols.



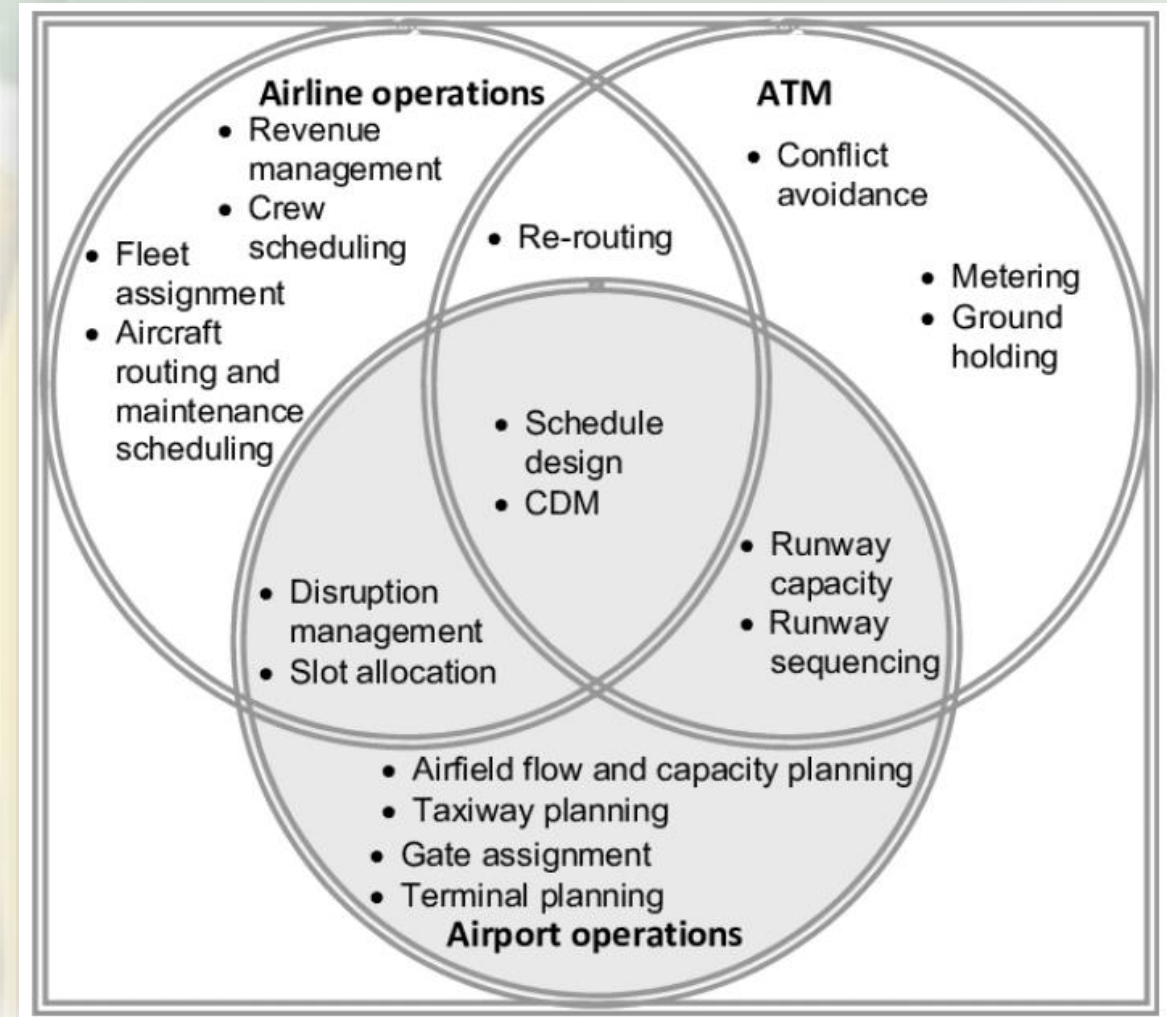
Communication Barriers:

- This can affect the implementation of comprehensive safety measures.



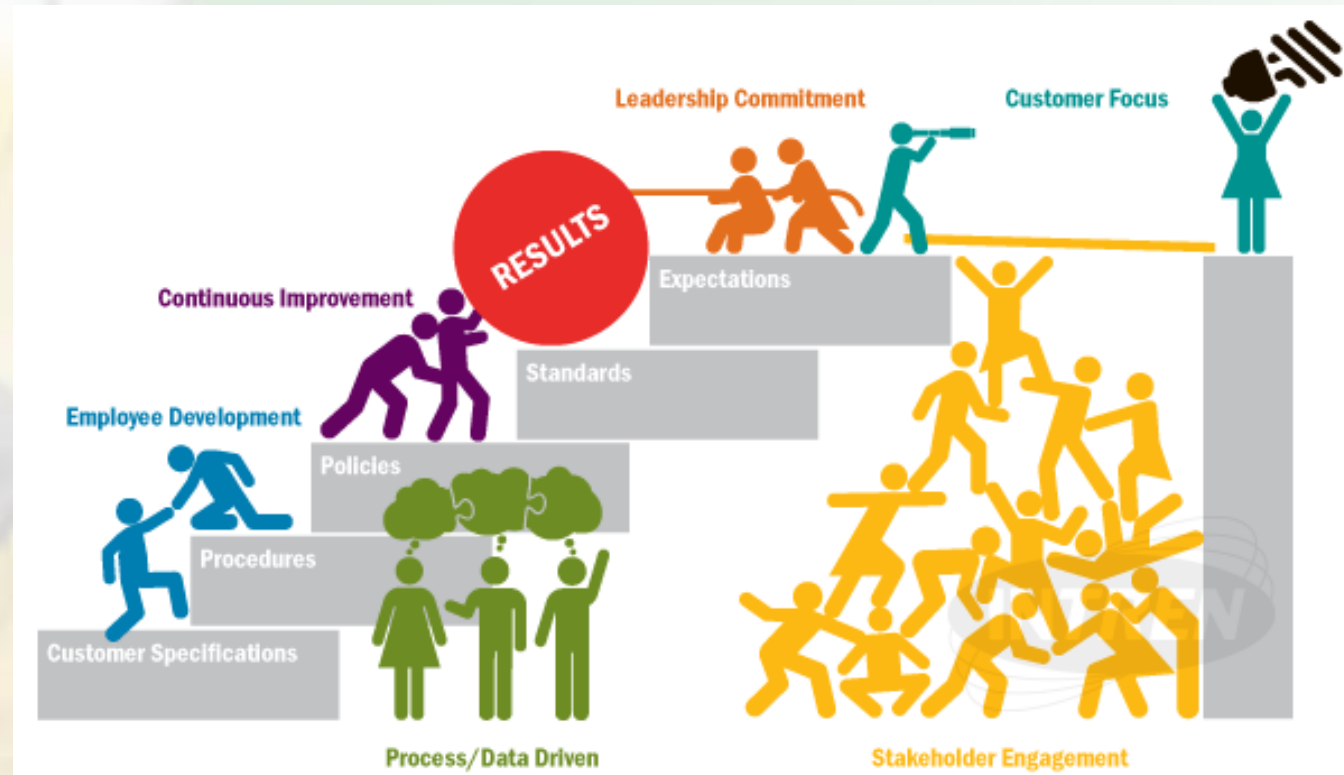
Resistance to Change:

- Inconsistencies in demonstrating and reinforcing commitment to safety at all levels of an organization can hinder the development of a cohesive safety culture.



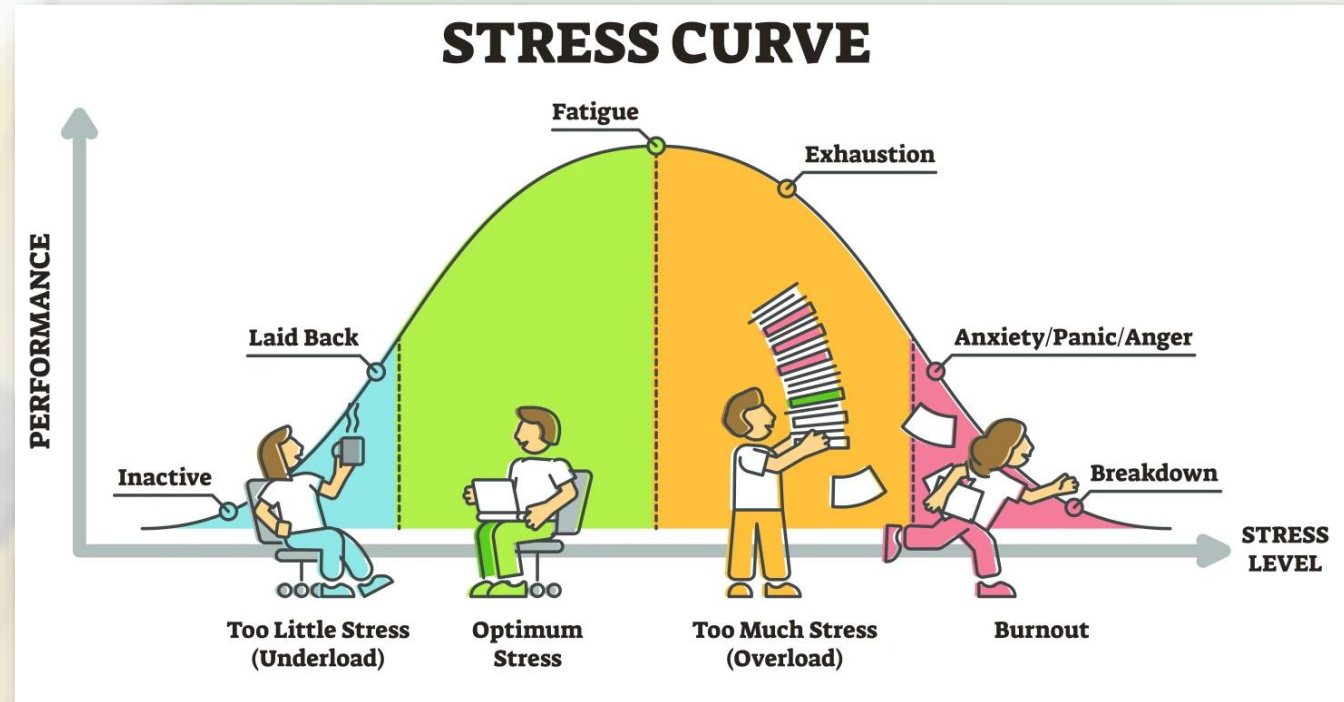
Balancing Compliance and Continuous Improvement:
