ROLE

QUALIFICATIONS AND EXPERIENCE

- Holder of a current Airline Transport Pilot License with a minimum of 5,000 hours as Pilot-in-Command of a multi-crew civil or military air transport aircraft.
- A minimum of eight (8) years' experience in airline transport operations.

Desirable:

- A University Diploma or Degree in Management or an Aviation-related field would be an asset.
- Working knowledge of the Guyana Civil Aviation Act and Regulations.
- Working knowledge of the relevant ICAO Annexes (1, 2, 6, 7, 8, 13, 18, & 19).
