



Safety Culture - shaped/influenced by...

- How an organization/employees behaves...(when no one is watching)...
- Individuals and groups values, attitudes, perceptions, competencies...
- Patterns of behavior that determine the 'level of commitment'...
- How one pictures or sees "Safety Culture" in an organization...
- How safety is perceived, valued and prioritized by management and employees...



What is Safety Culture?

Safety Culture:

- Deemed the single most important influence on the management of safety.
- A positive safety culture relies on 'trust' and 'respect' between personnel and management
- Empowers effective safety management and contribute to a safe work environment...
- Entails being aware of risks and known hazards and continuously preserving and enhancing safety...

ICAO Annex 19 – Safety Management

States and Service Providers - promote "Safety Culture" to foster effective Safety Management implementation through SSP & SMS.

Recommendation - 3.2.3.3 - States should:

...facilitate promotion of a positive safety culture in the aviation community

Recommendation 3.5.2 – States should:

- Promote Safety Awareness
- Share and Exchange Safety Information
- Foster Maintenance and Improvement Of Safety
- Support Development a Positive Safety Culture

Standard - 5.3.5 States shall take necessary measures, including the promotion of a positive safety culture, to encourage safety reporting...



Lack of a Safety Culture

Safety Culture – can directly impact safety performance:

- Important to build and promote a Positive Safety Culture...
- If safety culture is viewed as 'not' important, it can result in:
- Cutting corners, skipping steps or phases, making unsafe decisions...
- Likelihood of underperforming...(inefficiencies)

Lack of a Safety Culture

Safety Culture – can directly impact safety performance:

- Increase risks and hazards in operation, and in maintenance...
- Leads to serious incidents and accidents in aviation...
- Result in injury, loss of lives...
- Loss of assets, disruption in service...

Poor Company and Safety Culture

Promech Air, Inc. DHC-3
 Aircraft Accident (NTSB Report)

 Crashed into Alaskan mountainous terrain on June 25, 2015.

 Resulted in the death of nine (9) persons. ...inter alia...

- ✓ Poor Safety Culture
- ✓ Poor Safety Practices...
- ✓ Competitive pressure on Pilots
- ✓ Lack of safety program, etc.



Safety – Everyone's Business

It is the responsibility of all stakeholders:

- Individuals, Aviation Personnel, Aircraft Operators,
- Maintenance organizations,
- Regulatory bodies, Airports
- Air Navigation Service Providers, etc.

...to ensure that aviation operation is conducted safely...

Importance of Safety Culture

- Safety is of utmost importance in the aviation sector... "IT SAVES LIVES"
- A strong **Safety Culture** is crucial to reducing risks...
- ...and reducing the causes for incidents and accidents...
- Accountability and responsibility for safety is shared...
- Signals confidence in air travel for passengers...
 - ...when there is a major accident, air travel is adversely affected...



Promoting and Maintaining Safety Culture

- To attain a strong aviation culture requires organizations to:
 - Demonstrate commitment...Political and Organizational will...
 - Prioritize Safety in its policy and the decision making process...
 - Continuously advocate safety and educate employees on safety initiatives
 - Reminding employees of safety goals and objectives...
 - Encourage open communication and information sharing...
 - Mandatory & Voluntary Reporting...
 - Confidentiality and fairness...



Key Considerations

- Adherence to established safety policies, procedures and regulations...
- Providing regular training and development of personnel ...
- Ensuring timely maintenance of aircraft, etc.
- Investigating incidents and accidents...
- Benefiting and improving from lessons learnt...
- Establishing Safety Management Systems...
- Gathering data/information and utilizing same to make improvements...

Organizational

- Championing healthy and positive safety culture reflects commitment to safety.
- A positive safety culture encourages personnel to identify and report hazards...
- Allows for safety issues to be communicated through safety reporting systems...

Global View

- Reduce risks, and reduce or mitigate against accidents and incidents...
- Will promote confidence and facilitate efficient passenger travel...
